Indigenous Student Success

Sturgeon Public Schools remains committed to supporting Indigenous student success with a range of initiatives. From September 23rd to 27th, students will participate in National Truth and Reconciliation Week activities, including Division-wide daily guides for teachers, school-based events, and commemorating Orange Shirt Day on September 27th. The permanent Tipi at Sturgeon Composite High School continues to serve as a hub for cultural teachings, and two additional Tipis will be erected at Four Winds and Camilla Schools in the spring. Looking ahead to 2024-2025, SPS is focusing on key strategies to enhance community partnerships, foster safe school environments, and promote academic success for Indigenous students. These efforts aim to integrate Indigenous culture into the learning experience, foster meaningful engagement, and create reciprocal connections with local Indigenous communities.

Policy 900: Student Conduct and Discipline

At the September 23, 2024, Public Board meeting, the Sturgeon Public Schools Board of Trustees approved updates to *Policy 900*: *Student Conduct and Discipline* in response to Ministerial Order #014/2024 – Standards for the Use of Personal Mobile Devices and Social Media in Schools. Over the summer, Administration updated relevant procedures to ensure a smooth transition to the new standards at the start of the school year. By implementing these changes now, the Division is well-positioned to comply with the Ministerial Order, which requires full policy adoption by January 1, 2025.
